

Mentor responsibilities include the following:

Reaching out to your Warfighter once a month by email, text, call, video call, or face-to-face.

- Ensuring that your Warfighters know who you are, why you are volunteering as a mentor, and how you will be providing guidance or resources.
- Take the extra time to learn about who you will be mentoring and what their hobbies and interests are.
- Recording time spent looking for resources, interacting with your mentee, or other volunteering opportunities you participate with Operation Second Chance or other OSC coordinated events.
- If any problems arise with contacting, interacting with, or mentoring your Warfighter, please contact the Program Director via phone or email: (301) 972-1080; andy@operationsecondchance.org
- (Not Required) Feel free to reach out to other Mentors through Facebook or LinkedIn!
- Warfighters may also choose to reach out to their Mentor for Resources pertaining any issue that may arise after they discharge from service. If you cannot find the appropriate resources or would like more information on a certain type of resource, contact the Program Administrator.
- The Program Director will pair you with a Warfighter and ensure you have all the information needed to volunteer your time, but it is your responsibility to reach out and contact the Warfighter pertaining their application.
- If you know an applicant that is requesting mentorship or resources and him/her is not assigned to you. You may request transfer of Mentorship, if Warfighter is not settled with their Mentor.
- If at any time you wish to take a break from volunteering or wish to discontinue service entirely, please contact the Program Administrator.
- At all times conduct yourself as a volunteer of a reputable non-profit, ensuring all mentoring of your Warfighters is done in a professional and helpful manner.
- Even though your role title and description are to provide guidance and mentoring to an individual, your skills may be required by another Warfighter. Any time spent with another Program Applicant should be recorded so your volunteer time can be recorded.
