2017 was a record year for Operation Second Chance. With your help, we provided more than \$890,000 in emergency financial assistance and morale related retreats and outdoor sporting events to more than 3,300 individuals. Assistance ranged in the form of mortgage and rent payments, utility payments, flights and lodging, as well as morale boosting activites.

Each of us at Operation Second Chance are working hard towards fulfilling our mission of serving our brave men and women, that have either been wounded, injured, or are ill. Our mission is to support these Veterans and their families by building relationships, identifying their immediate needs, and acting on behalf of their best interests, when they need us the most and in the most efficient way we can.



LETTER FROM THE BOARD

We believe OSC is among the very best Veteran's Service Organizations for a number of reasons. First of all, we are big enough to make a difference. Of the more than 45,000 veterans service organizations identified by the Bush Center Military Service Initiative, more than 80% have less than a \$100,000 operating budget. Our financials show we are substantially bigger than that. Second, we have a wide geographical footprint with programs and services from Maryland to New York, to Virginia to Florida, to Texas and Montana. Third, we have a broad portfolio of programs and services including direct financial assistance, multiple day retreats, fishing, adaptive skiing and golf, hospital visits and day trips, as well as nights out. We also provided caregiver retreats, allowing some respite, for those caring for their loved ones. Fourth, we have a long and strong track record of sound financial management. Our low overhead is among the best in the non-profit sector. Fifth, OSC has been externally recognized by multiple independent evaluators of non-profits, including a four-star Charity Navigator rating. OSC was most recently named as the best charity in Maryland by The Washington Post business.org

In short we are big enough to make a difference, we have enough reach to touch veterans all over the United States, we can help them in a variety of ways that match their diverse needs and we manage our donor's money rigorously.

We have many choices on how to spend our time and energy in this phase of our lives. We choose to devote a good chunk of it to Operation Second Chance. We hope you too will choose to support this great organization that is totally dedicated to serving our wounded, ill and injured veterans.

Emergency Flights and Lodging

Operation Second Chance knows that having family by your side is critical to the healing process. The financial burden of last minute flights or long hotel stays should not be added to the stress of families working to recover. In 2017 Operation Second Chance provided:

150 Flights for 76 Families165 Hotel Stays for 92 Families

Assistance

152 Families were prevented from becoming homeless by providing rental and mortgage assistance.

68 Families had power, water, and heat by providing assistance with utility bills.

57 Families were provided with grocery cards to help put food on their table.





In 2017, Operation Second Chance provided 6 paid internships to veterans and caregivers across the country.





Retreats

Operation Second Chance held more then 60 retreats in 9 states in 2017. Retreat locations include Montana, Texas, Florida, and Maryland

After an IED exploded under my position in the truck bed, launching the GMV in which I was riding over 70 feet, back in August 2009, I was extracted from Afghanistan and given a 0% chance of living during the early days of my month and a half coma. Luckily all of the doctors were wrong and against all odds, I not only woke from the coma, but was able to walk and talk again.



While I'm totally bummed that I'm no longer allowed to be a Marine Raider, I am beyond ecstatic to, not only be alive, but to have healed up so well that I'm virtually indistinguishable from a person who has never been injured.

A massive Thank You to everyone involved with Operation Second Chance, for all that you've done for me and everything that you continue to do for all of us! You are the best!



Revenues

OSC has created consistent and significant annual revenue growth since its founding in 2005. This year, 2017, broke all records with \$1.82 million in total contributions.



10.4% Overhead Ratio

The public places an incredible amount of trust in non-profits to ensure their contributions truly benefit the intended cause. For 13 years running, OSC has averaged an overhead ratio of less than 10%. This means more than 90 cents of every dollar donated to OSC has directly benefited America's wounded veterans in need.
